- As part of our strong commitment to promoting a drug and crime-free academic community, this Office will spearhead the 2024 Search for Ten Outstanding KaPADyak Students for the SY 2023-2024. This is in line with the **KaPADyak Project** dubbed as "Kabataan, Kapulisan, at Pamantasan nagkakaisa sa Paglaban sa Illegal na Droga at Krimen"
- 2. The objectives of the search are the following:
 - a. to recognize students who have made significant contributions to the fight against criminality, drug abuse, and addiction; and
 - b. to highlight students' works that would serve as motivation for others to join the cause of Anti-Illegal Drug and Crime Prevention Strategies and Initiatives for the SY 2023-2024.
- 3. The competition is open to **undergraduate students** from higher education institutions. Attached are the criteria and guidelines for the competition.
- 4. Participation in the competition is **FREE**.
- 5. The deadline for submission will be on June 30, 2024.
- 6. Certificates and cash prizes will be awarded to the winners of the competition.
- 7. The following are the legal bases/references for the conduct of said activity:
 - Republic Act No. 7722, or the Higher Education Act of 1994;
 - Section 28.5 of the CHED Memorandum Order No. 09, series of 2013 or the "Enhanced Policies and Guidelines on Student Affairs and Services";
 - CHED Memorandum Order No. 42, series of 2005 or the Implementing Guidelines for the Creation of the Student Crime Prevention Councils in all Colleges and Universities;
 - CHED Memorandum Order (CMO) No. 18, series of 2018 or the Implementing Guidelines for the Conduct of Drug Testing of Students in all Higher Education Institutions; and
 - Executive Order (E) No. 66, series of 2018, or the Institutionalizing the implementation of the Philippine Anti-Illegal Drugs Strategy or PADS.
- 8. The active participation of all Higher Education Institutions in Region 1 is encouraged.

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2024 SEARCH FOR TEN OUTSTANDING KAPADYAK STUDENTS

CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES

1. Admissibility. The 2024 Search for Ten Outstanding KaPADyak Students is open to all undergraduate students, whose ages are between 18 – 25 years old, whether graduating or non-graduating, and enrolled for the SY 2023-2024.

2. **Eligibility.** Students should have demonstrated exemplary performance in leadership and service, and made significant contributions to the fight against criminality, drug abuse, and addiction. Additionally, they should serve as motivation for others to join the cause of Anti-Illegal Drug and Crime Prevention Strategies and Initiatives.

3. The Nominee must not have been subjected to any disciplinary action. The nominee must have no record of violating any of the rules and regulations of the university/school, as certified by the head of the institution. A nominee who does not meet this requirement will be automatically disqualified from the selection process.

4. **Preliminary Search.** The preliminary search will be based on the application forms disseminated to the different schools in Region 1.

5. **Point System.** The Search Committee will implement a point-based evaluation system, followed by a ranking process.

6. **Interpretation of Points for Ranking.** To determine the final ranking, the weighted ranks obtained by the individual nominee in the different areas (leadership and awards, service, essay, and interview) shall be summed, with the total serving as the basis for the final ranking. Only twenty (20) students will be considered as finalists.

7. **Endorsement**. Each higher education institution can endorse a maximum of two (2) student nominees.

8. **Deadline for Submission of Documents**. The submission of the names and pertinent documents shall be on or before the 30th of June 2024.

9. **Composition of the Screening Committee**. The Screening Committee shall comprise a CHED Official as the chairperson and NGA Sectors as members.

10. The presentation of the awardees is scheduled during the KaPADyak Conference in September 2024.

- 11. Organization of Documents. Nominees are required to organize their documents in a folder properly labeled according to the arrangement provided in the score sheet. This will facilitate easy identification of documents being referenced. Preliminary scoring should be carried out using the attached score sheet and a pencil for recording scores. A required format must be followed, as outlined below:
 - Font Size: 12
 - Font: Arial
 - Paper size: Long bond paper
 - True copy of documents must be clear



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- Soft/Hard Bound
- Color of the folder: Blue

12. **Authenticated Supporting Documents.** All supporting papers must be attached and authenticated. All original documents must be presented to the screening committee upon submission of documentary requirements for validation purposes.

13. **Second Stage of the Search**. In the second stage of the search, the committee will invite the final twenty (20) candidates for essay writing and final interview. After the deliberation, the committee will select the final ten (10) outstanding students.

14. Final Decision. The decision of the Search Screening Committee shall be final.

CRITERIA

The Search for the Ten Outstanding KaPADyak Students shall be based on the following criteria:

Leadership and Awards	30%
Service	40%
Essay	10%
Interview	20%

(Only membership and involvement in accredited student organizations will be considered with a maximum of three (3) positions for each year)

The equivalent of President is any relative term, like Chairman, Governor, etc. As reflected in the preceding set of criteria, within class organizations, a student can earn a maximum of two points for being president, but only once. Any additional presidency at the same level, will only incur one (1) point each. All other positions below the president will earn the student 0.5 points each. The same scoring system applies to college and universitylevel organizations, although points may vary depending on the level and position. These variations are detailed in the aforementioned set of criteria.

To determine the nominee's leadership standing, the total points earned from the evaluation of their submitted supporting documents shall be multiplied by 3.0 (the assigned point value for leadership). The individual with the highest weighted points will be ranked number 1, and so forth.

Supporting Documents Needed:

- a. Appointment or Certification from Adviser
- b. Certificate of Commendations/ Appreciation/ Recognition
- c. For an elective position, a certification is required from the Student Affairs Office indicating officership through election.
- d. Certificates, photos of medals, trophies, and other proof of awards
- e. Certificate of Attendance/Participation (for No. 2); Certificate of Commendation
- f. Other documents to support the claims

B. Service – (Covered for the last 3 years and applicable during his/her stay in the tertiary level) – 40%

- b. Appointment/Certification from the Barangay Captain/Mayor/President of the NGO during his/her service
- c. Pictures of the PPAs conducted
- d. Copy of the policies formulated/contributed (minutes of the meeting) and implemented related to Drug and Crime Prevention Education
- e. Other documents to support the claims
- D. Essay 10%

E. Interview - 20%

1. The topic for the essay during the finals (top 20) shall be given on the date identified by the CHED.

2. After the writing exercise, the interview shall immediately proceed.

3. For the interview, the Search Committee shall act as the panel of interviewees.

The interview will be graded based on the following:

a. Substance	- 40%
b. Articulation/ Spontaneity	- 20%
c. Bearing	- 20%
d. Confidence	- 10%
e. Input	- 10%
