## **CHED Regional Memorandum Order** No. 5 s. 2024

### PARTICIPATION IN THE 2024 SEARCH FOR TEN OUTSTANDING KAPADYAK STUDENTS

FOR: ALL PRESIDENTS/HEADS Higher Education Institutions Region 1

- 1. As part of our strong commitment to promoting a drug and crime-free academic community, this Office will spearhead the 2024 Search for Ten Outstanding KaPADyak Students for the SY 2023-2024. This is in line with the KaPADyak Project dubbed as "Kabataan, Kapulisan, at Pamantasan nagkakaisa sa Paglaban sa Illegal na Droga at Krimen".
- 2. The objectives of the search are the following:
- a. to recognize students who have made significant contributions to the fight against criminality, drug abuse, and addiction; and
- b. to highlight students' works that would serve as motivation for others to join the cause of Anti-Illegal Drug and Crime Prevention Strategies and Initiatives for the SY 2023-2024.
- 3. The competition is open to **undergraduate students** from Higher Education Institutions. Attached are the criteria and guidelines for the competition.
- 4. Participation in the competition is **FREE**.
- 5. The deadline for submission will be on **June 30**, **2024**.
- 6. Certificates and cash prizes will be awarded to the winners of the competition.
- 7. The following are the legal bases/references for the conduct of said activity:
- Republic Act No. 7722, or the Higher Education Act of 1994;
- Section 28.5 of the CHED Memorandum Order No. 09, series of 2013 or the "Enhanced Policies and Guidelines on Student Affairs and Services":
- CHED Memorandum Order No. 42, series of 2005 or The Implementing Guidelines for the Creation of the Student Crime Prevention Councils in all Colleges and Universities;
- CHED Memorandum Order (CMO) No. 18, series of 2018 or The Implementing Guidelines for the Conduct of Drug Testing of Students in all Higher Education Institutions; and
- Executive Order (E) No. 66, series of 2018, or the Institutionalizing the implementation of the Philippine Anti-Illegal Drugs Strategy or PADS.
- 8. The active participation of all Higher Education Institutions in Region 1 is encouraged.

# 2024 SEARCH FOR TEN OUTSTANDING KAPADYAK STUDENTS

### CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES

- 1. Admissibility. The 2024 Search for Ten Outstanding KAPADYAK Students is open to all undergraduate students, whose ages are 18 25 years old, graduating or non-graduating, and enrolled for SY 2023-2024.
- Eligibility. Who have shown exemplary performance in leadership, and service and made significant contributions to the fight against criminality, drug abuse, and addiction. He/She also serves as motivation for others to join the cause of Anti-Illegal Drug and Crime Prevention Strategies and Initiatives.
- 3. Nominee not subjected to Disciplinary action. The nominee should have no record that he/she has been subjected to disciplinary actions for violating any of the rules and regulations of the University/School as certified by the Head of the School. A nominee who does not meet this requirement is automatically disqualified.
- 4. Preliminary Search. Preliminary search shall be based on the application forms to be disseminated to the different schools in Region 1.
- 5. Point System. The Search Committee will adopt the point system. Ranking shall then be done.
- 6. Interpretation of Points in Rank. To get the final rank, the weighted ranks obtained by the individual nominee from the different areas (leadership and awards, service, essay, and interview) shall be added, and the sum shall be used as the basis for the final ranking. Only twenty (20) students shall be considered as finalists.
- 7. Each higher education institution can endorse a maximum of two (2) nominees
- 8. Deadline for submission of documents. Submission of the names and pertinent documents shall be on or before the 30th of June 2024.
- 9. Composition of the Screening Committee. The Screening Committee shall comprise CHED Official as Chairman and NGA Sectors as members.
- 10. Awarding will be done during the KaPADyak Conference on September 2024.



- 11. Organization of Documents. The nominees should organize the documents in a folder properly labeled following the arrangement done in the score sheet in a manner that makes it easy to identify which documents are being referred to. Preliminary scoring should already be undertaken using the attached score sheet and a pencil for the scores. A required format should be followed to wit:
  - Font Size 12
  - Font Aerial
  - Long bond paper
  - Clear Photocopy of documents
  - Soft/Hard Bound
  - Color of the folder- Blue
- 12. Authenticated Supporting Documents. All supporting papers must be attached and authenticated. All original documents must be presented to the screening committee upon submission of documentary requirements for validation purposes.
- 13. Second Stage of the Search. For the second stage of the search, the committee shall invite the final twenty (20) of the candidates for the essay writing and the final interview. After deliberation, the committee shall come up with the final ten outstanding students.
- 14. Final Decision. The decision of the Search Screening Committee shall be final.



#### CRITERIA

The Search for the Ten Outstanding Kapadyak Students shall be based on the following:

Leadership and Awards	30% pts.
Service	
Essay	10% pts.
Interview	20%pts.

The equivalent of President is any relative term, like Chairman, Governor, etc. As reflected in the foregoing set of criteria, at the level of class organizations, a president can get the maximum credit of two points only once. Any additional position as president at the same level will give the student only one (1) point each. All other positions below that of a president will earn .5 each for the student. The same is true for college and university-level organizations. The points, however, are higher or increased depending on the level and the position. These can be seen in the set as mentioned above of criteria.

To determine the standing of the nominee in leadership, the total points earned by him as a result of the evaluation of the supporting documents that he has submitted shall be multiplied by 3.0. (the number of points given for leadership). The one who gets the highest weighted points shall be ranked No.1 and so on.

Supporting Documents Needed:

- a. Appointment or certification from Adviser
- b. Certificate of Commendations/ Appreciation/Recognition
- c. For Elective Position, a Certification from the Student Affairs Office indicating officership through election.
- d. Certificates, photos of medals, trophies, and other proof of awards
- e. Certificate of Attendance/Participation (for No. 2); Certificate of Commendation
- f. Other documents to support the claims



## B. Service – (Covered for the last 3 years and applicable during his/her stay in the tertiary level) -40%

1. Speaker, Facilitator, Organizer in Seminars, Workshops, Conferences, Congress, etc. related to Drug and Crime Prevention Education

- b. Appointment/Certification from the Barangay Captain/Mayor/President of the NGO of his/her service
- c. Pictures of the PPAs Conducted
- d. Copy of the Policies formulated/contributed (minutes of the meeting) and implemented related to Drug and Crime Prevention Education
- e. Other documents to support the claims.

D. Essay – 10% E. Interview – 20%



- 1. The topic for the Essay during the finals (top 20) shall be given on the date identified by the CHED;
- 2. After the Essay writing, the interview shall immediately proceed;
- 3. For the interview, the Search committee shall act as the panel of interviewees, who will conduct the interview portion.

The interview will be graded based on the following:

a. Substance	- 40%
<ul><li>b. Articulation/ Spontaneity</li></ul>	- 20%
c. Bearing	- 20%
d. Confidence	- 10%
e. Input	- 10%
